

2 Peter 3:8-15a



Mark 1:1-8

"Prepare the Way"

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. 





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Eucharistic Prayer A

Celebrant: Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Celebrant: We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.

Communion Notes: All are welcome to come forward and receive communion or a blessing. Communion is offered in two kinds: bread and wine. One may receive the bread alone, dip it into the wine, or drink from the chalice after consuming the bread. Sealed, pre-packaged containers of bread and wine are available. Gluten-free bread may be requested by crossing one's hands palms-down. All manners of reception are valid. A blessing may be requested by crossing one's hands over the chest.

Anointing for Healing: After communion is received, those in need of prayer for healing of body, mind or spirit, may join the priest at the kneeler along the wall. Feel free to kneel, or stand, to receive an anointing of oil. Prayer requests may be spoken or unspoken.

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What do you think?

The St. Michael's Vestry needs your help to make a decision! Since 2016, the icon of the Archangel Michael has hung on the wall in the back corner of the Nave. We are trying to decide whether to keep it there, replace it with something else, or leave that space empty.

At the moment you will notice that, in that place, is a tapestry of the Lord's Supper, which used to hang in our chapel room. Before you share your opinion about the future of that corner, please read the following:

The Case for *Keeping* the Archangel Icon:

We are St. Michael's Episcopal Church; our patron saint is St. Michael. In the Book of Revelation, St. Michael commands God's army against Satan's forces: "And war broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels fought against the dragon." It is only appropriate that we have an icon of our patron saint as depicted in our Holy Scripture in our sanctuary.

The Case for *Removing* the Archangel Icon:

While the above Scripture is indeed an important part of our identity as St. Michael's, in its depiction of an act of fatal aggression it may not accurately convey our values, particularly in a space intended for worship. Like all Scriptural symbols, we will continue to read this passage and learn from it. But this particular symbol, presented without context, does not align with our message of Love and Forgiveness.

I believe the wall in the corner of the Nave should feature:

□ The original icon of St. Michael
☐ The Lord's Supper tapestry
\square Nothing, or something else to be determined later
