Nathaniel Paul Jacobs (1994-2024)

Nathaniel Jacobs was born June 11, 1994 in Kansas City, Mo., to Paul and Victoria. He spent his first 12 years in Kansas City before the family moved to Colorado. There, Nate fell in love with the mountains and would spend his time snowboarding, skateboarding, and fishing with the lifelong friends he made. He could usually be found at his computer gaming with his friends or in the middle of a mosh pit at a hardcore show.

Nate worked closely with his father as a painter, a career that stuck with him throughout his life. He had the ability to make anyone laugh and was always there for those around him. Nathaniel departed this life on December 13, 2024. He is now with his father, Paul, and grandmother, Dorothy.

He leaves behind his mother Victoria, stepfather Jason, sister Sydney (Kevin), brother Benjamin, sister Katie (Tony), grandmother Sally, and grandfather Jeff. Nathaniel will be remembered for his humor, his kind heart, and his distinct and infectious laugh.

About the Service

The liturgy for the dead is an Easter liturgy. It finds all its meaning in the resurrection. Because Jesus was raised from the dead, we, too, shall be raised. The liturgy is characterized by joy. In the certainty that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.

This joy, however, does not make human grief unchristian. The very love we have for each other in Christ brings deep sorrow when we are parted by death. Jesus himself wept at the grave of his friend. So, while we rejoice that one we love has entered into the nearer presence of our Lord, we sorrow in sympathy with those who mourn.

Comfort us in our sorrows at the death of our brother; let our faith be our consolation, and eternal life our hope. *Silence may be kept*.



Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

All: We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

Celebrant: And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with St. Mary, St. Michael the Archangel and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.
